Principal's Report

A lovely evening was had on Monday at the Year 6 Farewell, our official function to acknowledge our graduating students. After dinner and dancing, each student was presented with their graduation certificate. We also acknowledged families who are finishing their time at Normanhurst with their youngest child in Year 6. Thank you to the amazing organising committee of dedicated parents and Mr Sheridan; to Ms Taylor who spent many hours collating information and photos for the year book; and to Ms De Palo and Ms Moore for all of their work in rehearsing dances with the students and creating a photo montage for the event. Goodbye and good luck Year 6 2019 – we will miss you!





Reflections on 2019

2019 has been a productive and exciting year at Normanhurst Public School. With the continuation of our 2018-2020 three-year School Plan, developed with input from staff, students and parents, we have initiated and continued a range of programs towards our strategic directions of responsible and reflective learners; collaborative and innovative practice; and effective and adaptable systems.

2019 has seen us focus on formative assessment and feedback from teacher to student, student to student, and student to teacher as a means for students to focus on individual goals and make maximum progress in their learning. It has seen our Positive Behaviour for Learning program continue and expand, with implementation of processes to support students in meeting expectations and developing skills to assist them to function in and

contribute to broader society. We have collaborated with a number of local schools and opened up our classrooms to share practice and invite feedback on progress on our initiatives, with this outsider view assisting us to reflect on our practice and set goals for our next steps. We have also integrated new technological resources within our teaching programs, including Robotics equipment, and held our annual parent forum, this year focused on engaging our community with the content and processes of the Science and Technology curriculum.

Physically, our school has undergone considerable transformation this year, with our new security fence, a number of new access ramps, new roofing, landscaping work, the installation of our K/1 playground equipment, painting work, an upgrade to the furniture in our library and a redesign of our administration space.

In 2019 we have seen many impressive achievements across our school. Just to list a sample of these:

- Two students represented Beecroft Zone at the Sydney North Area Swimming Carnival; two students competed at Area level in Cross Country and three students progressed to Area level in Athletics
- One of our students progressed to the regional level of the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking competition after winning the district final
- Two students received offers for the 2020 Opportunity Class and eight students received offers for Selective High schools
- Both our girls and boys PSSA T-ball teams made the grand final of their respective competitions, with the girls' team winning their grand final
- Our Senior Choir performed at Sydney Town Hall as part of the 2019 Primary Proms event
- The artwork of one of our students was selected for publication in the Calendar for Cultural Diversity, which is distributed to schools all across the New South Wales public education system, and another student's artwork was selected as runner-up in the OzKids Art Program
- Our Junior and Senior Dance groups auditioned successfully for the Sydney North Dance Festival and placed second in their respective sections in the Battle of the Primary Schools, and our Boys Dance group was highly commended in their section at The Hills Dance Spectacular
- 300 of our students completed the Premier's Reading Challenge, with 12 students receiving a platinum award for seven years of participation in the challenge
- In ICAS competitions our students were awarded 39 Distinction and 10 High Distinction awards.
- Our students raised money to support drought-affected farmers and Stewart House, and donated Christmas gifts through the Kmart Wishing Tree Appeal
- Our canteen received Healthy School Canteen status
- All students embraced the environmental initiatives of Nude Food Days and Return and Earn recycling; and
- Our school was identified by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority as having demonstrated substantially above average gain in NAPLAN.

They did a fantastic job and ensured everyone got into the festive spirit. Office News

Student Wellbeing – Health Care

The office staff are currently reviewing and updating Individual Health Care Plans in preparation for students transitioning to new classes for 2020.

Information about allergies, medical conditions such as asthma, anaphylaxis, diabetes and other health care related issues should be provided to the school by parents and updated every 12 months. This information will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's individual health and wellbeing for the upcoming school year. We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and be kept confidential.

When a medical practitioner has prescribed medication that must be administered during the school day, parents are responsible to request the school's support in writing. Students must not carry medications unless there is a written agreement between the school and the student's parents that this is a planned part of the student's individual health care support.

Please consider the following points when communicating with our school about your child's health care needs:

- ✓ liaise with the child's medical practitioner about the implications of the child's health condition for their schooling.
- ✓ where medication is prescribed, ask the medical practitioner whether the medication is available in a form which minimises or eliminates the need to provide the medication during the school day.
- ✓ convey all relevant advice and information from the medical practitioner to the school
- ✓ provide prescribed medication and 'consumables' for administration by the school in a timely way and as agreed with the principal and described in your child's Individual Health Care Plan.
- ✓ collaborate with the school in planning to support the child's health needs at school including updating information and reviewing plans.

Please contact the front office (9489 1152) should you require a note requesting the school's support for your child's personal health care needs. Those parents who have already provided the school with this relevant information need only inform the school if your child's health care needs have changed.

Lost Property

If your child has misplaced any belongings please check our lost property bin located just outside the front office. On Friday, all lost property items that have not been claimed will be donated to the uniform shop clothing pool.

Please label all your child's belongings with their full name and current class so we can return it back to them. So many items of clothing are not labelled with student names and sadly many items are never returned. Please help us with keeping lost property to a minimum and label your child's clothing!

The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

Step 2

The school endorses your application.

Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off[†]
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel

Secondary students aged 16 and over can travel with a Child/Youth Opal card when carrying a NSW/ACT Senior Secondary Student Concession Card, available from school offices.

End of year road safety tips for parents and carers

The lead up to Christmas and the holiday period can be a very busy time of year. With this comes traffic congestion, fatigue and distraction. Here are some tips to help you get through it:

- Allow extra travel time to get to places.
- Avoid alcohol if you plan to drive
- If travelling with packages in your car, place them in the boot or restrain them with a seatbelt to avoid them moving about while driving. In a crash unrestrained objects can cause severe injury to vehicle occupants.
- Ensure pets are properly restrained.

Tips for preparing to walk or cycle to school in 2020

Now is a great time to think about and plan how your family will travel to school next year. Walking (even part of the way), cycling, or catching a bus to school is a great alternative to school zone congestion.

- Plan a safe route with your child/ren
- Identify safe crossing locations.
- Discuss how to spot dangers such as vehicles exiting driveways.
- Be aware of your surroundings
- Leave balls, mobile phones, and headphones in your bag.

NSW double demerit driver and rider offences

Double demerit points apply for speeding, seatbelt, motorcycle helmet and mobile phone offences during the following holiday periods:

Christmas Day to New Years Day:

Starts Friday 20 December 2019 to Wednesday 1st January 2020 (inclusive).

Australia Day:

Starts Friday 24th January 2020 to Monday 27th January 2020 (inclusive).









In the car - Journeys with kids

It is important your child is restrained in the correct child car seat for their age and size:

- It is recommended to keep children in a booster seat until they are at least 145cm in height
- A child that is correctly secured in an approved child car seat is less likely to be killed or injured in a crash than one who is not.

Parking Rules


Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



Within 10m of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights (20m with traffic lights), unless a sign states you can park there (see image at left).

PENALTIES FROM: \$344
Demerit Points apply




Within 20m before and 10m after a bus stop (see image)

PENALTIES FROM: \$268
Demerit Points apply in School Zone


Parallel parking

This is the usual way to park unless signs tell you otherwise. You must park in the same direction as the adjacent traffic and parallel and as close as possible to the kerb.



You can NOT park across driveways or pedestrian kerb ramps. A vehicle can be parked up to the wings on the driveways or ramp (see image)

PENALTIES FROM: \$268
Demerit Points apply in School Zone



You should park at least one metre from any other parked vehicle and entirely within any marked parking lines where provided (see image)

PENALTIES FROM: \$114


