
Principal's Report

Dear Parents and Carers,

2021 Kindergarten Transition

Yesterday the first of our 2021 Kindergarten Transition mornings was held. It was wonderful to meet the children who will be commencing next year. The Transition Program will continue next week. We are also holding an information session for 2021 Kindergarten parents this Friday via Zoom. Details have been emailed and provided in the Kindergarten packs to relevant parents. Because an important aspect of transition is meeting future classmates and teachers, our 2021 Kindergarten teachers are working with the children during the transition mornings.

End of Year Events

You may be aware that recently there were announcements of coming changes to some restrictions for schools. However, although there is some easing in terms of parents being able to be on site for specific events and purposes, there is still a range of points with which schools need to comply. These include ensuring the venue has the capacity to observe the 4 square metre rule for all people participating. We have spent considerable time looking at options for this that may have allowed parents to attend our special events but unfortunately, even if

we altered arrangements for these events to reduce the number of students involved and only allowed one parent of each student involved to attend, we would not be able to comply with the capacity rules. We are thus continuing with our original plan, which was to video parts of these events and have these available for relevant parents. We understand it is disappointing not to be able to attend these events but we must comply with these health requirements.

Tell Them from Me Survey Topics

This week we are continuing the series to provide further information about the operations of our school. This week's topic is meeting with me! In the TTFM survey, there is a question related to being able to easily meet with the principal. I certainly make arrangements to meet with any parent who requests to do so but please be aware:

- I am usually not able to meet without some notice. Where I have made arrangements to be at an event or activity with your children, or already have other meetings scheduled, it is generally not possible to change these arrangements at the last minute. In my five years at Normanhurst PS I have always prioritised being directly involved with our students. I attend every assembly, see students off as they leave for excursions, visit classrooms, and even teach a maths extension group each week. These commitments to your children are important and I need to honour them.
- It is also the case that there are some issues that should be raised with the classroom teacher in the first instance. It may then be appropriate to contact the Stage Supervisor or myself if the issue is not resolved to your satisfaction. It is the procedure for most workplaces that the person connected to the issue should be given an opportunity to resolve it initially. In this way, it assists parents and teachers to work in partnership to support the best outcomes for our students.

2021 Planning

This term we are planning for 2021 classes. To assist in this process, it is most helpful if we have accurate student numbers. If your child will not be returning to Normanhurst Public School in 2021, please send written advice of this to me as soon as possible.

If you have particular information related to your child's 2021 placement of which you feel we need to be aware, please put this in writing (letter or email) addressed to myself and ensure I receive it prior to Friday 27 November at the absolute latest. Please note that changes will not be made after classes are formed so if you have any information you wish to be considered we need to be advised of it now. If you have submitted such requests in the past, you will need to re-submit these for 2021. It is also important that the information is received in writing and directed to me, as verbal requests to class teachers will not be considered.

Please note, this is not a process to request specific teachers. Assumptions should also not be made that teachers will necessarily be teaching the same year level in 2021 as they have previously. All of our teachers are qualified to teach K-6 and allocations are made based on preferences teachers submit to me and the overall effective operation of the school.

The written requests we do receive prior to the deadline will be considered when forming classes for next year. However, in the context of many factors needing to be addressed, we cannot necessarily meet all requests.


Positive Behaviour for Learning

If you play **brass, winds, strings or percassion**, we are **auditioning new members to join** in Term 4 for 2021



Asquith Boys High School is offering places in 2022 for their Year 7 Enrichment Class.




The Enrichment Class caters for students who are talented in literacy and numeracy, providing challenging extension opportunities that include creative and critical thinking.
