A reminder of the Term 2 COVID Protocols

- Term 2 operational settings will remain largely the same as
 Term 1 with additional measures to support continuity of classroom learning.
- Isolation requirements for close contacts have changed meaning that from last week students and staff can return to school as long as they have no symptoms and follow the close contact guidelines to do so, including daily rapid antigen testing (RAT) and wearing a mask indoors.
- Additional supplies of RAT kits have been distributed to all students at Normanhurst PS.
- NSW Health have updated the advice for students and staff returning to school after testing positive for COVID-19 including the recommendation to wear a mask for an additional 3 days after the 7-day isolation period.
- No student or staff member identified as a close contact will be permitted to participate in in overnight excursions, including school camps.

What to expect in Term 2

The Cross Country is on Thursday 5 May for years 3-6. Permission notes and information was sent to via Skoolbag. Our year 6 students will be going to Berry Sports and Rec Camp in week 3, 11 - 13 May. Term 2 - Road Safety



Do you know how to use the No Parking zone at your school?

Most schools have a No Parking zone at the front or near it. These zones are designed for drivers to stop for no more than two minutes to dropo for opickup a passenger. The driver must remain with their vehicle at all times. NO PARKING ZONES ARE NOT DESIGNED FOR DRIVERS TO SIT AT THEIR LEISURE UNTIL THEIR CHILD APPEARS.



- If your child(ren) is being picked up from the No Parking zone outside the school, only stop there when they are ready to enter your vehicle. If they are not waiting within the zone, move away and come back later. This will free the zone up for other drivers whose passengers are waiting?
- If your school runs an organised pick-up program from the No Parking zone at the front of the school, follow the instructions issued by the school executive.
- When dropping your child at school within the No Parking zone, ensure you have given them a hug and kiss at home, so the child can leave the vehicle independently, to minimise your time within the zone.

As you are aware, walking to school has many benefits for students, parents and the surrounding community, Walking with your child will help then develop viral road crossing skills and is an opportunity to teach them about road safety and independence. It also gives you both exercise, gets you out of the car and away from the traffic congestion, reducing air pollution and car dependency.

A challenge to all Australian Primary Schools and Councils

National Walk Safely to School Day (WSTSD) is on Friday 20 May 2022. Now in its 23rd year, the annual campaign encourages all primary school children, their parents and carers to walk safely and regularly to school.

The event seeks to promote road safety, health, public transport and the environment.

Australian children are becoming less active. One substantial contributor is the decline in walking and/or taking public transport to school. Children who are regularly physically active are healthier, perform better academically and are less likely to be obese or overweight. Sedentary behaviour can lead to long-term and costly risks of illnesses such as heart disease and diabetes.

Walking regularly is the best exercise because you can build it into your daily routine.

The objectives of National Walk Safely to School Day are:

- . To encourage parents and carers to walk to school with primary school age children
- . To promote the health benefits of walking and create regular walking habits
- To help children develop vital road crossing skills and ensure children up to the age of 10 years hold an adult's hand when crossing the road
- To reduce car dependency and traffic congestion
- . To reduce the level of air pollution created by motor vehicles
- . To promote the use of public transport

How to participate (detailed information is at walk.com.au):

Enclosed is the WSTSD kit which contains tattoos and posters for school and council noticeboards. We ask that every student wears a tattoo on the day to help promote this important community event. Other ideas include:


- · Use the teachers' Tool-Kit and publish WSTSD information in your school's newsletter


